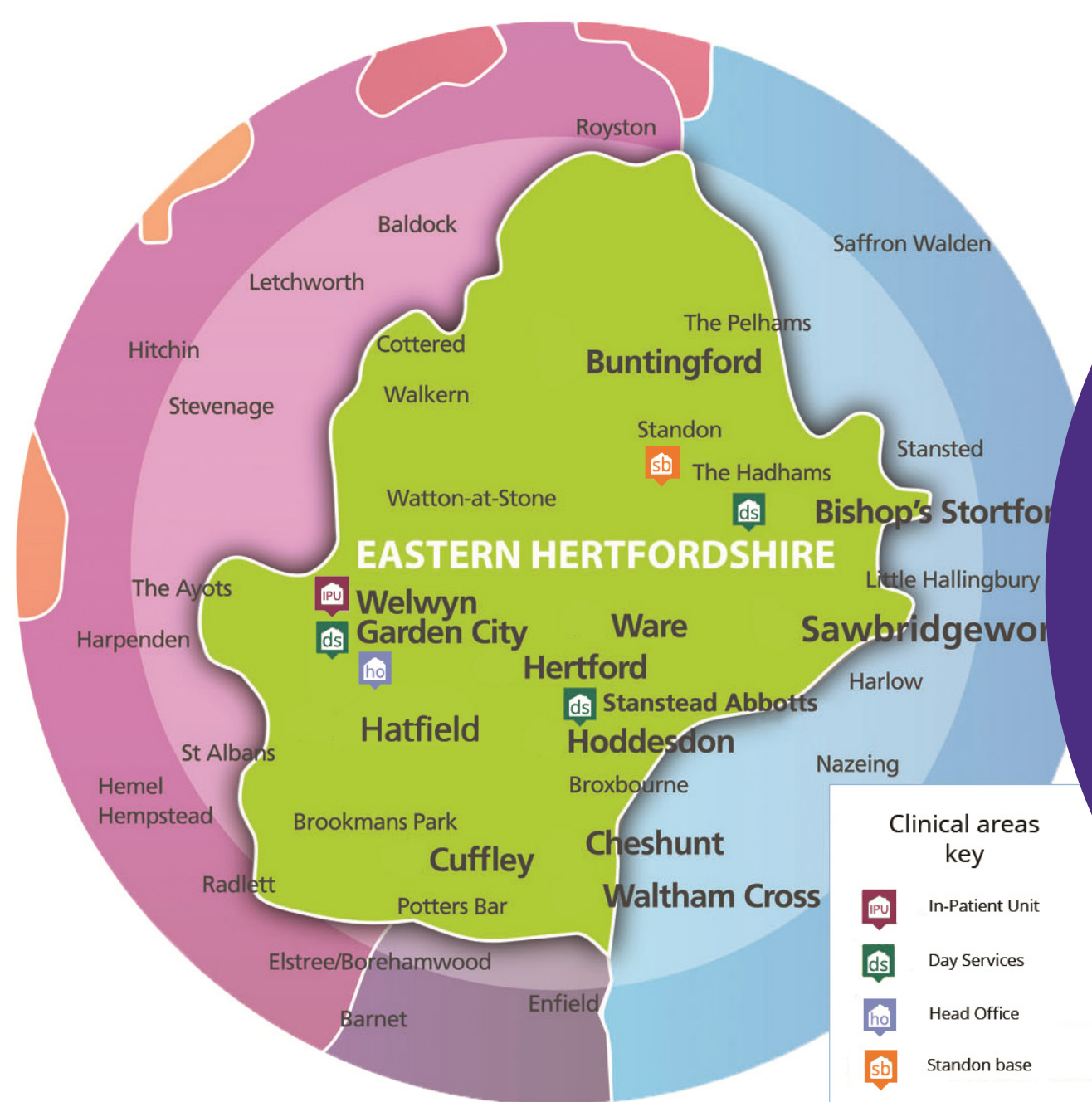


# Isabel Hospice Schwartz Rounds give opportunity to share the impact of common experiences

At Isabel Hospice the underlying premise for Rounds is that the compassion shown by staff can make all the difference to a patient's experience of care, but that in order to provide compassionate care staff must, in turn, feel supported in their work.
